Our curriculum focuses on student achievement of five school-wide learning results – what each student should know, understand and be able to do when he or she completes the planned program at Holy Nativity School. These results, which are integrated into classes and activities at all levels of the curriculum, call for students to be:

1. Self-directed learners who:

- Demonstrate the joy of learning and appreciate that learning is a life-long pursuit.
- Exhibit a solid foundation in core academic subjects as well as demonstrate knowledge and appreciation of the arts.
- Apply effective study skills that include time management, organizational and test taking skills.
- Are able to work independently.

2. Responsible and respectful individuals who:

- Exhibit Christian values.
- Demonstrate a concern for the rights of others and show respect for individual and cultural differences.
- Participate in community service.
- Develop knowledge of political, social and historical settings of the community.

3. Collaborative, cooperative group members who:

- Demonstrate adaptability and flexibility.
- Contribute as a member of a team toward a common goal.
- Are comfortable taking on different roles within a group.

4. Critical thinkers who:

- Take increasing responsibilities for their own learning as they mature.
- Generate creative, new ideas academically and artistically.
- Demonstrate the ability to utilize resources.
- Ask questions and seek answers; display intellectual curiosity.
- Recognize the evaluate problems and devise and implement problem-solving strategies.

5. Effective communicators who:

- Utilize conventional spoken and written language.
- Listen and respond effectively and appropriately to written and verbal messages.
- Are able to use technology as a tool to enhance communication and research.
- Use appropriate language to solve interpersonal and intrapersonal problems.
